COOKING CLASS ~ 3RD & 17TH

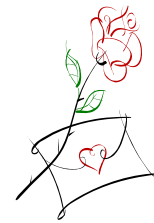

TEE TIME POLICY

- ◆ Tee time reservations can be made 2 weeks in advance. Reservations will be accepted in person in the golf shop or by telephone calls to the golf shop. Voice mails, e-mails and messages left with Gini are **not** considered a "booked" tee time.
- ◆ A Member can reserve up to 4 tee times. Names are to be assigned to the tee times as soon as possible. If names have not been assigned to the time(s) within 48 hours of play the time(s) will be released.
- ◆ Please check in with the golf shop before teeing off. This will assist tremendously in reducing billing errors.
- ◆ As our club continues to grow and more members are enjoying The Reserve Club courses, it becomes necessary to pair up twosomes. The pairing of twosomes will maximize the available tee times and permit more golfers to enjoy play during peak hours. **The golf shop staff will pair twosomes as needed.**

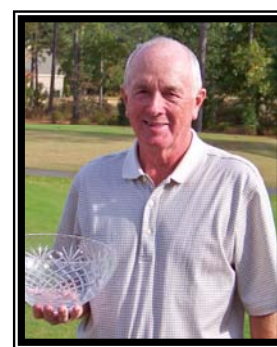

SUPERINTENDENT'S CORNER

Hello Members and Happy New Year,

It's hard to believe another year has passed. With the cold of winter officially set in I get a lot of questions as to what we should be working on in our home lawns. While the winter months do provide a break from the routine of mowing, watering and fertilizing there are still many things we can be working on to prepare for the busy spring ahead.

Soil testing is one fairly inexpensive practice that should be performed yearly on home lawns. Soil testing can help to identify any underlying issues that may be limiting turfgrass health. Testing will also provide detailed information as to nutrient requirements and soil pH. Information gained by testing will allow you to more accurately apply the necessary nutrients to promote a healthy turf stand. Healthy turf is the best defense against weeds, diseases and many insects of turf.

The key factor when soil testing is the process of taking a correct sample. For most home lawn settings sampling the front yard separate from the back would be recommended at least the first few tests. A good sample consists of 15 to 20 soil cores randomly taken with a 1/2 to 1 inch soil probe at a depth of 3 to 4 inches. The thatch and turf should be removed from each core and all cores mixed thoroughly in a clean bucket. All you will then need is about a one pint sample to send off for testing. The local county extension office provides soil testing and help answering any questions about testing procedures. You will need to know what type of grass your home lawn is for accurate recommendations. Hope this helps and there are many good web sites that help walk you through taking a good soil sample.

Winter time is also a good time to service your lawn mower and sharpen its blades. Blades should be sharpened about twice a year. Check all the heads on your irrigation system. Make sure all heads are turning and adjusted to properly irrigate the intended area. For most areas and lawns little water is needed during the winter months. Some plants can also be pruned during the winter, crape myrtles are one example. Enjoy your winter months.

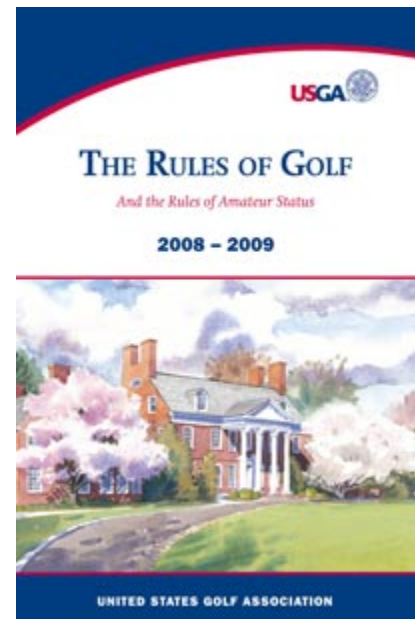
