GOLF COURSE NEWS & NOTES

Happy New Year From Your Golf Course Maintenance Staff!

As we enter 2010 we will take time to reflect on the past year, as we develop ways to improve our courses. One improvement includes the addition of the white target rings into the cups, which was completed in December. These rings, which I am sure you have noticed, have dramatically improved the golf holes' visibility. With this added visibility the golf round will be sped upwards of 10~15% by eliminating the need for pin tending. Another advantage of these rings is the stability of the golf hole. The golf holes edges will last longer, resulting in quicker recovery of replaced plugs. During winter months, as the greens go dormant, these old pin placements damage easier and are noticeable for weeks at a time.

Another improvement to the course will require your help. We have noticed more unfixed ball marks on the greens. Ball marks while small in nature can impact the playability of golf greens dramatically. It is extremely important to repair these ball marks in the winter months when turf is dormant. Dormant turf is very slow to heal, unfixed or improper fixing of ball marks can lead to turf loss and or knock putts off-line. Repairing ball marks is not only important to the health of the green it also helps to insure a smoother rolling surface. Ball marks left unfixed have less chance of healing correctly each hour they go unfixed. Thank you for your help.

How to repair ball marks:

Step 1: Take the repair tool and insert prongs into the turf at the edge of the depression. It is important that you insert the tool at the edge of the depression and not into the depression itself.

Step 2: This is perhaps the most important and delicate step. Push the edge of the ball mark towards the center. Do not push the depression upward, as this will only tear the roots. Once the roots have torn and become detached, these depressions will die.

Step 3: Once you have worked the repair tool around the edges of the depression, pushing the turf toward the center of the depression and then gently tamp down the repaired ball mark with you putter or foot. This will help smooth the putting surface.

If you do not have a repair tool, please inquire at the Pro Shop as how to obtain one. And as always, we look forward to seeing you out on the courses.
