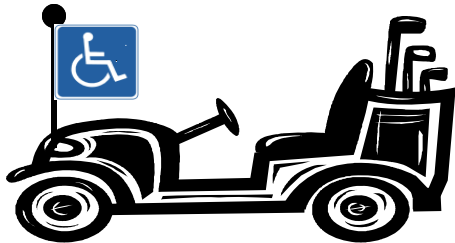

GOLF CARTS/HANDICAP FLAGS



As the number of golfing members who require a handicap flag increase, it is important to abide by the following guidelines when using a golf cart with a handicap flag:

1. Please keep carts at least 30 feet away from the greens complexes.
2. Please keep carts at least 15 feet away from the tee complexes.
3. Please avoid steep slopes at all times.
4. Handicapped Cart privileges are extended only to the player who is physically challenged and not to the additional rider.

FROM THE COURSE

Hello Members & Happy New Year!

Each January I like to take time to recap the passing year. What were we happy with, where are changes needed and how can we continue to do a better job, are all questions I ask myself. Last January two of my goals for 2010 were to increase the healing time of our greens during aerification and maintain more consistent greens speed and smoothness throughout the year. From my perspective we were successful in accomplishing those goals. There were many factors, including weather, which assisted in those successes. Two areas of focus for us in 2011 will revolve around our fairway cut widths and continued work to firm up green approaches. I guess you could say these are my "New Year Resolutions".

From my perspective one of the reasons our Reserve Course is so busy is because it is player friendly. One area we will review and make changes to in 2011 will be our fairway cut widths. All par 4 and 5 fairways cuts will be widened. Our focus will be at landing areas and near green complexes. Wider fairways will provide less penalty for slightly off target drives. Wider fairways also means less rough and hopefully that will go a long way in making your round enjoyable. Some fairways may be widened as much as ten yards in spots. This work will take place late April as we begin to green up.

We will also put more focus on firming up some of the approaches to our greens, allowing approach shots that land short of the greens to bounce on in some cases. In most cases we have already installed drainage in some of our wettest spots. Our next step will be to apply light frequent topdressing sand and aerify. We already aerify all approaches each spring in conjunction with greens aerification, this summer we will aerify these areas a second time. Topdressing will take place on a monthly schedule. Currently we have been using some of the old sand coming out of the bunkers we are redoing on the Reserve course to top-dress these areas.

I am also pleased to announce that we will be moving up the start time at Hollow Creek to match that of the Reserve Club. While we currently do not do shotgun starts at Hollow Creek, we will open it up to tee times at 8 a.m. to match that of The Reserve. This move will open up six earlier tee times in our hotter summer months. Currently both courses open at 9 a.m. December thru February due to weather. This change will take place in March. This means tee times will be available from 8 a.m. till 10 a.m. and again from noon to 2 pm. Please check with the pro shop if you have any questions with regards to this.

GOLF DRESS CODE REMINDERS

Men's Permitted Attire:

Golf type shirts with collars and sleeves. Mock collars are acceptable. Shirts are to be tucked in. Golf slacks and Bermuda length golf shorts are acceptable.

Men's Prohibited Attire:

Tee-shirts and tank-tops of any kind. Denim of any kind and color. Cargo type pants/shorts, cut-offs, tennis attire, gym/work-out clothing and swim suits.

Women's Permitted Attire:

Sleeved and sleeveless golf type shirts or blouses with or without collars. Slacks, capri pants, golf skirts, dresses and Bermuda length golf shorts are acceptable.

Women's Prohibited Attire:
